
Thirteen cars from Mad Max Fury Road are up for sale

Next to it in its shadow is the XB Interceptor, burnished to bare metal.

"This is the backbone of the Mad Max franchise," says Geoff.

From a stock production muscle car, its metamorphosis from Ford Falcon into the Interceptor began with the first film.

"This is one of the first cars that you see, I guess as part of the chase on Fury Road," says Geoff.

Its 12 cylinders growl on ignition, as does every other car.

More than 80 of the 130 cars that were made bespoke for the film were destroyed during filming, looking for what the biz calls a "practical" special effect; real explosions, real damage, rather than the virtual reality of CGI.
